Appendix A: HIV Policy Lab Dataset, SOURCES

The HIV Policy Lab database draws from three major sources of information. First, we collect and code legal and policy documents as primary sources. These are indicated in the dataset with source name and links to original documents. Second, we draw on official government reports submitted to UNAIDS and WHO under the Global AIDS Monitoring system's annual NCPI survey. Third, we augment these with validated, high-quality secondary sources on specific topics. The full list of sources is listed and described below with links to the materials. Law & Policy Documents

HIV Policy Lab Reference Library: The reference library for the HIV Policy Lab makes primary legal and policy documents available online. Formal Government & Civil Society Reporting

National Commitments and Policy Instrument (NCPI), UNAIDS: NCPI is an annual survey through which governments formally report information on their existing HIV/AIDS policies, administered as part of the UN Global AIDS Monitoring (GAM) reporting system. This information is validated for internal consistency and completeness by UNAIDS and WHO—with illogical responses corrected, countries contacted in cases of missing data, and validation against primary sources for selected laws and policies. The Instrument consists of Part A, completed by governments, and Part B, completed by nongovernmental respondents including civil society, the private sector, bilateral agencies, and United Nations organizations. It is maintained by AVAC, an NGO that uses education, policy analysis, advocacy, and a network of global collaborations to facilitate the development and delivery of new HIV prevention policies.
