

Philippines

The Philippines reported its first case of COVID-19 on January 30, 2020. Starting March 16, the government instituted Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ). ECQ, the strictest of all levels was initially planned to end on April 30, but was subsequently extended to May 15 in selected areas. During ECQ, the medical sector, agricultural sector, delivery and courier services, as well as manufacturing and supply-chain activities related to these sectors have been maintained at full capacity. Establishments related in the provision of essential goods and services such as public markets, grocery stores, and the like; as well as media establishments, are allowed to operate at 50% capacity. Financial services such as banks, other medical and dental services, water supply and sanitation services, and telecommunications and utilities, and other services were limited to a skeletal workforce.

On June 1, the government moved Metro Manila and other high-risk areas from a "modified enhanced community quarantine" to a "general community quarantine," which allows more businesses to reopen and mass transportation to resume in phases. As of writing, Cebu City, which had been under "enhanced community quarantine" from June 16 to July 15, has transitioned to a less restrictive "modified enhanced community quarantine."

United Kingdom

COVID reached the United Kingdom in late January, 2020. The government introduced a range of measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 including travel restrictions, social distancing measures, closures of entertainment, hospitality, non-essential shops and indoor premises, and increased testing. A national lockdown was introduced on 23 March. Essential workers included health and social care, education and childcare, key public services (including those essential to the running of the justice system, religious staff, charities and workers delivering key frontline services, and journalists and broadcasters who are providing public service broadcasting), local and national government, public safety and national security, transport, utilities, communication and financial services (including staff needed for essential financial services provision, the oil, gas, electricity and water sectors, information technology and data infrastructure sector and primary industry supplies to continue during the COVID-19 response, as well as key staff working in the civil nuclear, chemicals, telecommunications, postal services and delivery, payments providers and waste disposal sectors). The government have encouraged businesses and workplaces to encourage their employees to work at home, wherever possible.

Georgia

Georgia has registered the first case of Covid-19 on 28 February 2020. However, the country started implementation of national response measures as early as in January, even before the WHO has declared it as a pandemic. Regulations started with mandatory thermo screening at the airports and suspension of flights from high-affected areas, leading to cancelation of all air travel on March 14-16 and follow up cancelation of public events, schools did not open after winter holidays and employers were urged to switch to home-based working mode, wherever possible.

Georgia declared a state of public emergency on March 21, which included cancelation of public transportation, curfews and lockdown for up to two months. Jobs included under essential list included healthcare, agriculture, critical infrastructure (roads, construction, water and sewage systems), wholesale, storage and transportation, police, defense and rescue services. The hospitality sector continued operation and they served as quarantine zones (on average, 5 000 individuals were quarantined). Jobs that were restricted included street sale, art and entertainment, retail service other than food and pharmacy products (online sales were also restricted for small period of time). All schools, kindergartens and universities were encouraged to switch to teleworking. All conferences, seminars and similar events were similarly encouraged to telework, as were most of the public servant positions and the financial industry (banks, insurance).

On May 22, Georgia started gradual relaxation of strict measures.

South Africa

The first COVID case was confirmed in South Africa on 5th March 2020. A nationwide lockdown was put in place from midnight March 26, with only critical workers and transport services, the banking sector, essential food and medicine production, and retail, operating. On May 1, 2020, a phased lifting of the lockdown began, allowing a few sectors to resume operation and others only partially. On May 13, a further relaxation of the lockdown was announced effective June 1. Most economic activities reopened under strict health and social distancing practices except for high-risk ones (i.e., restaurants, bars, taverns, accommodation, domestic air travel, conferences, events, entertainment, sporting activities, and personal services). Remote work is still encouraged where possible.

In May 2020, South Africa introduced a Covid-19 Temporary Employer-Employee Relief Scheme (TERS) for employers who were struggling to pay salaries due to loss of business during the lockdown. The COVID-19 TERS was aimed at preventing job losses and mass retrenchment of workers. The country further introduced a Special COVID-19 social relief of distress (SRD) grant which paid ZAR 350 (USD 20) for unemployed citizens and residents. Despite these measures, unemployment rates and poverty in South Africa still increased. A National Income Dynamics Study Coronavirus Rapid Mobile Survey conducted in June reported that more than 3 million people had lost their jobs and one of a breadwinners did not earn any income in April. Most of the job losses were among the most vulnerable low-income and grant receiving households. The South African economy was, however, already before the COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdowns only compounded the unemployment problem. Although all lockdown restrictions finally lifted on 20 September, the South African government expects a slow recovery of the economy, predicting an 8.2% contraction which will keep unemployment and poverty rates high.

Pakistan

The first two COVID cases were recorded in Pakistan on 26th February 2020. Starting on March 23, both the federal and provincial governments implemented measures to contain and mitigate the spread of the virus. These included selective quarantines, border closures with neighbouring countries, international and domestic travel restrictions, school and university closures, banning of public events, social distancing measures, and varying levels of lockdown across the country.

Since mid-April, the federal government, in coordination with provinces, has gradually eased lockdown arrangements, by allowing 'low-risk industries' to restart operation and 'small retail shops' to reopen with newly developed Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). In addition, restrictions on domestic and international movements have been lifted (e.g. domestic flights, train services, and international flights have resumed).
